You will have approximately **5 minutes** to deliver a short talk that addresses any or all of the following questions and issues. You are welcome to respond to these questions directly, or to come up with alternative / additional questions that you feel are more appropriate to your organization.

1. Provide a brief description of your organization and the services you provide. Who is the target population of these services?
2. Discuss your past and ongoing work with various Edmonton communities. Which services have been most successful and why? Which services have been less successful and why? Will you provide these services again? Would you do anything differently in the future?
 - a. Did your program meet the needs of the community organizations you worked with? How could it have met these needs in a better way?
3. Are there resources that the University could offer your program to facilitate your service provision to the Greater Edmonton community? Such resources might include any or all of the following: 1. infrastructural support (i.e. transport to and from programs; University space); 2. educational support (instructors, volunteers, University accreditation / alternate documentation for individuals who complete certain programs); 3. technological support (communications, a/v services).
4. Imagine your dream program: what would you accomplish, who would you assist, and how would the University help to realize your vision?
